Welcome to the Six Flags® Read to Succeed Six Hour Reading Club!

Your child's school is participating in an exciting program that encourages students in grades K through 6 to read for fun. *Read to Succeed* is a free program sponsored by Six Flags Theme Parks. Every student who completes six hours of recreational reading before the school's deadline noted below is eligible for a free admission ticket valid at one participating Six Flags Theme Parks. Students will develop a greater appreciation for books when they see that you think reading is important too. You are sure to have fun as you investigate the world of reading together!

Here's what you need to know:

- Only students in grades K through 6 are eligible to participate.
- Review the attached reading log. Your child should use this sheet to record what and how long he/she reads.
- Your child must complete six hours, or 360 minutes, of recreational reading.
- Please initial each entry and then sign the reading log to verify that the six hours of reading has been completed.
- Your child can read books, magazines, newspapers, or comic books. Reading for homework or a class assignment does NOT count.
- Students can read silently, aloud, or with an adult—you can read to your child, or your child can read to you.
- Remind your child to return the reading log to his/her teacher by the date on the log.
- Late entries will NOT be accepted.

About the Tickets

- Tickets will be awarded to students by their teacher/coordinator.
- The ticket is valid for admission to one Six Flags theme park on **select dates only** during the 2015 season. Park name and valid dates will be printed on the tickets.
- Tickets are valid for students in grades K-6 only and are not valid for anyone over the age of 13. No exceptions.
- Each ticket is valid for one free admission only.
- Tickets are not for resale and are nontransferable.
- They cannot be replaced if lost, stolen or damaged.

We hope that you and your child enjoy this free program and spend time reading together.

Introductions and approval of October and November minutes.

- 1) Principal's Report (Paul Hohl)
 - a) Christmas concert on Monday December 15. Doors open at 5:45pm. Student prelude at 6:00pm, concert at 6:30pm.
 - b) New reading textbooks are in for K5-2 and 5th grade. New reading textbooks for 3 & 4 are being ordered from money raised by the Catholic Schools Walk and future fundraisers.
 - c) Standardized testing in spring. All Choice students grades (3-8) per DPI requirements will take a standardized test online known as Badger Test, which includes an achievement test and a performance task.
 - d) We are still determining which test Grades 3/5/7 will take per Archdiocesan requirements - IOWA test as in the past or the new Badger Test.
 - e) Open house, January 25th. Three main target groups:
 - i) recruiting of new families,
 - ii) inviting parishioners to explore the school, and
 - iii) high attendance of current families (both to check out your child's room this year and look ahead to the next year classrooms and teachers).
 - f) School choir to sing at 8:00am Mass on Dec.7th and Jan. 11th.
- 2) Treasurer's Report (Jen Sveda)
 - a) Home and School made the first (of three) Parish contributions for the year - \$11,600. Contribution goes toward supporting a teacher position.
- 3) Chair Reports
 - a) Time & Talent (Kim Nistler)
 - i) New volunteer form coming along.
 - ii) Brainstorming possible volunteer initiatives to get the word out on what's going on and more involvement from the community.
 - iii) Discussion on teacher dinners. Try hosting by certain grades, pot luck for one and catered for the other. Coordinated between the grade liaisons and the specific grades to host. Will rotate grades every year to cover fall and spring teacher dinners.

- b) Loaves & Fishes (Gloria Rios)
 - i) People can still purchase items at the website using the schools code for the school to continue to raise money. Website is www.gaschoolstore.com, school code is 2535623
 - ii) Sold 169 waterpark passes!! Up from 110 last year. Thank you to Mrs. Saeger for coordinating!
 - iii) Box Top competition being planned for after the holiday break.
 - iv) Looking into having an online purchase option for Spirit wear sales.
 - v) Received several new playground balls through Labels for Education collection!!

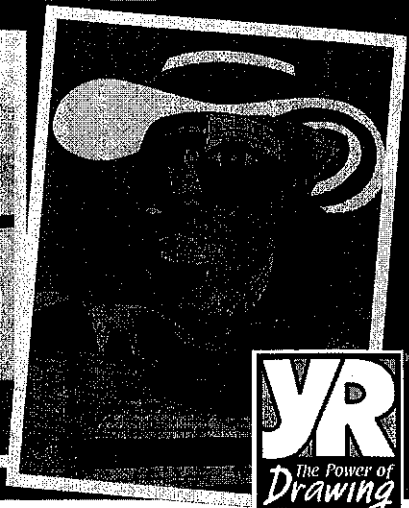
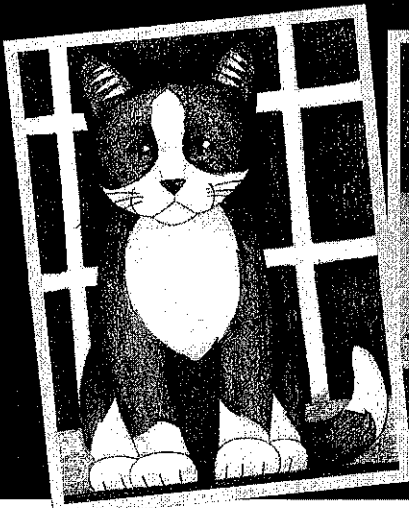
- c) Faith & Academics (Elizabeth Drew)
