Attention Girls, Grades 3-8

Have you ever thought about playing Lacrosse???

The **Brookfield Lacrosse Youth Girls Program** is looking for players and we are hosting a free "try-it" event at the **Midwest Orthopedic Sports Complex (formerly Brookfield Indoor Soccer Complex)** on **Thursday January 21st** from **5:30 to 6:30 pm**.

WHO: Junior Girls (Grades 3-5) play 7v7 plus a goalie on a reduced sized field
Senior Girls (Grades 6-8) play 11v11 plus a goalie on a regulation field

WHAT: Lacrosse is called "the fastest game on two feet". Lacrosse shares many of the same concepts desired in other sports such as Soccer (conditioning and positioning), Hockey (stick handling), Basketball (offensive and defensive principles) and Track (running/sprinting). Girl's lacrosse focuses on speed, finesse, field awareness and strong stick skills. Lacrosse is truly a North American sport. Native Americans first developed the sport of lacrosse thousands of years ago! Girl's lacrosse players wear goggles for eye protection and mouth guards. Goalies wear full padding including a helmet (provided by the team). Otherwise all you need is a stick and a pair of cleats!

WHEN/WHERE: Lacrosse is a Spring sport. Indoor practices start in mid-February and move outdoors when weather permits at our home field, Wisconsin Hills Middle school. Games are played on Saturdays and Sundays beginning in April, through early June (there are never games on Easter, Mother's Day, or Memorial Day weekend). Once the season starts, practices are typically every Tuesday and Thursday evening but the exact practice schedule is still to be determined.

WHY: Be on a Team, Get in good shape, Learn new skills, and...

- **DSHA has added Lacrosse as a fully sanctioned sport starting in 2017.** Currently, DSHA girls are in a coop with the Brookfield girl's high school program.
- **CMH has a team, a coop with the Waukesha public high schools.**
- **Brookfield East/Central is planning to make lacrosse a full varsity sport in 2017.**
- **There are efforts underway to add girl's lacrosse at the high school level at Wauwatosa East/West.**
- You are at a great age to start playing lacrosse. Many top collegiate players did not start playing lacrosse until junior high or early high school.
- Lacrosse participation is growing nationally. Growth is especially strong in the Midwest.
- At the Collegiate level, new women's lacrosse programs are being added all over the United States each year.

About Our Program: The Brookfield Lacrosse Association plays in the MAYLA (Milwaukee Area Youth Lacrosse Association) conference. This is a recreational level conference with a strong emphasis on player development. We try to win but our main goal is to give your daughter a very positive experience while developing her lacrosse skill-set. We play against teams from Arrowhead, Ozaukee, Northshore, Whitefish Bay, Franklin, Mukwonago, Kenosha and Waukesha.
