HIGH INTEREST DAY 2016

All about Sundaes with Gilles (1st and 2nd)

In a fun way we go over the history of ice cream, history of custard, history of Gilles's. Students get to make their own sundae, play "Guess that Flavor" and Gilles Bingo.

Black Belt Karate (1st)

Bookmaking—Crafting a Journal (3rd and 4th)

Students will learn the techniques of bookmaking and create their own unique stitched book for journaling. A variety of materials will be provided so students can customize their book to reflect their unique interests and personalities. Due to assembly and dry time, books will be returned to the students' homerooms on Monday for pickup.

See a Juggler! Be a Juggler! (3rd and 4th)

This is the hit, total participation, interactive program where YOU get to see a juggler...and be one! You'll get to see an awesome demonstration of skills first, then everybody gets a chance to become a Juggler by learning and trying out a whole variety of skills, including balancing peacock feathers, trick spinning Frisbees, and more!

Funky Fresh Spring Rolls (5th)

We will talk about the importance of eating healthy, and teach ways to make eating veggies for fun by creating your own uniquely flavored spring rolls

Pizza with Paula (6th)

You'll learn how easy it is to make your own pizza dough and then create your personal pizza with a large variety of ingredients.

Spelunking (5th and 6th)

Take the CAVING CHALLENGE and learn what it takes to participate in one of the coolest and fastest growing adventure sports in North America. In this session, you will learn facts about underground caving and have the opportunity to turn, twist and bend your body in the only caving simulator in the Midwest. The Speleo Cave is 5 winding levels high and 3 chambers wide with roughly 100+ linear feet of crawl maze. You will enter the Cave and navigate through the tunnel by contorting your body in order to traverse the challenging path, enhancing problem solving abilities and stimulating the mind. Speleo Cave is a blast!

Dartball (5th and 6th)

Come learn the game of Dartball taught by the St. Sebastian Dartball Team. Dartball is a game where darts are thrown at a large board that resembles a baseball diamond.

World Drumming (5th and 6th)

Learn to drum on the Djembe, bongo, bodhran cajon, Clong Yao and many other percussion instruments from around the world all while learning new Irish and bluegrass folk songs. You've never heard anything like this before. Presented by local performing artist Derek Byrne of Paddygrass.

Where's the Buzz? (5th and 6th)

Drones? Queens? Workers? It's not Star Wars, it's beekeeping! A popular hobby for many Milwaukee residents. Learn about the art and science of beekeeping. Find out what all the buzz is about?

It's Not Just Hot Air (5th and 6th)

Make a Cartesian diver, witness air pressure crush a can and inflate a balloon inside a soda bottle, plus learn how to keep water in a jar that is upside down. It's not magic, it's HOT AIR and your brain will be full of something more than HOT AIR when you are done with this class.

Chocolate! Chocolate! Chocolate! (7th and 8th)

Join us and learn how to make microwave fudge and other easy chocolate treat ideas that you can make on your own at home.

Tie Dye (7th)

A High Interest Day favorite! Students get to make a funky tie-dye shirt with our local experts, and bring it home for a groovy outfit!

Design Your Own Mug (8th)

Students will get the opportunity to design their own mug by drawing/painting on them with special markers. There will also be an opportunity to make a shrink disk tag/charm.

Glee (7th and 8th)

Get ready to have FUN singing and dancing with our high energy Artistic Director from Brookfield Center for the Arts! Kids will learn the joy of creative movement set to music, and will be led on an adventure, exploring songs from the ever popular musical, "Shrek!"

Recipe suggestion for this week is Resurrection Rolls. These rolls are easy to make and taste much like cinnamon rolls.

Resurrection Rolls

1 can Crescent Rolls

3 tablespoons of butter

Small bowl of cinnamon/sugar mixture (3 tbsp. sugar + cinnamon)

8 large marshmallows (one for each crescent roll)

Parchment paper or aluminum foil

Preheat oven to 350°. Cover cookie sheet with parchment paper or aluminum foil (melted marshmallows can be a mess). Melt butter. Dip and roll the marshmallows first in the melted butter, and then in the cinnamon-sugar mixture. Place each marshmallow on a crescent roll piece and wrap. It will look like a dough ball when finished.

Bake the rolls for about 10 to 12 minutes until they are golden brown and remove from the oven. Some of the melted marshmallow will probably escape but the parchment paper will help avoid a mess. Allow the rolls to cool for about 10 minutes. When cool, the roll may be cut in half to reveal that it's empty inside. Jesus has risen! The rolls are sweet, much like the resurrection story. Jesus died and rose to save us from our sins.

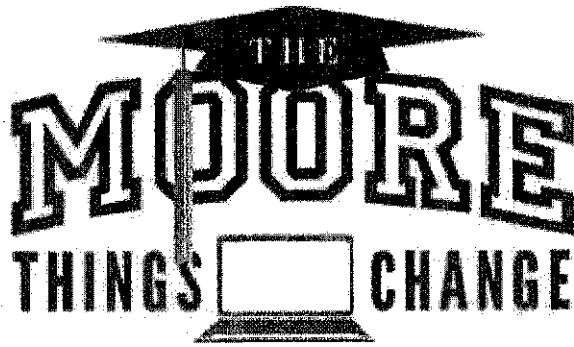
